Is your student struggling in classes?

- 1. Have your student talk to their teacher. Your student can go onto their School Loop account and email their teacher directly. If they click on the email icon next to their teacher's name in School Loop, they can start a conversation to share their concerns; you can be CC'd on this email to be kept in the loop. The teacher will be the best resource in understanding what needs to be done to earn a passing grade in this class.
- 2. Your student can attend our afterschool tutorial. It is held Monday through Thursday from 2:55 3:55 pm in room 702. We have teachers and peer tutors in there every day to help students with their homework.
- 3. Your student can also attend tutorial in this class Tuesday through Friday as long as they get permission from their regularly scheduled tutorial teacher to leave. Most teachers will allow students to attend different classes during tutorial as long as they ask first.
- 4. We highly recommend that every student use a planner to write down their homework every day. The more diligent they are about writing in their planner, the more likely they are to stay on top of their work.
- 5. Check School Loop regularly to ensure your student is turning in their work and staying on top of what needs to be done. How to START & FINISH your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) 2020-2021

1. Get your FSA ID: https://fsaid.ed.gov/

- It is a username and password used to log in to complete your FAFSA.
- Also used to sign legally binding documents electronically and access student loan information.
- Students need an FSA ID before they begin to complete the FAFSA.
- Parents need a separate FSA ID. Your parents can log in with your FSA ID to help you complete it.
- Takes 1-3 business days to process. START NOW!

OR

• New! Download the "MyStudentAid" APP to create your FSA ID! Easier and more convenient. The entire application is now accessible via the applif preferred.

2. Go to the FAFSA Website: https://fafsa.ed.gov/

By completing the FAFSA, students can also be considered for State and Institutional Aid (Grants, Scholarships, etc...

Information to Have On-Hand

- Social Security numbers
- Your driver's license number, if you have one
 Your Permanent Resident Card number, if you
 are not a U.S. citizen
- Federal tax information or tax returns, including IRS W-2 information from 2018 IRS 1040, 1040A, 1040EZ
- Foreign tax returns
- Records of untaxed income, such as child support received, interest income, and veterans non-education benefits
- Information on cash, savings and checking account balances, investments, including stocks and bonds and real estate but not including the home in which you live; business and farm assets

Financial aid is available to Dream Act students* attending a California community college.



California Dream Act students at community colleges are eligible to apply now for:

- Board of Governors Fee Waivers
- Assistance from EOPS, CARE and CalWORKs
- State financial aid like Cal Grants and Chafee Grants
- Privately-funded scholarships

Check with your local college financial aid, scholarship, EOPS, CARE and CalWORKs offices for assistance.

- * You are a **Dream Act** student (AB 540 eligible) if you meet all of the following criteria:
 - Attended a California high school for at least three years; OR attained the equivalent of at least three years of credits from a California high school and attended at least three full years at California K-12 schools;

AND

- Graduated from a California high school, got a GED or passed the California High School Proficiency Exam;
- Are registered or enrolled at a California community college;

AND

If required, complete an affidavit saying you have filed (or will file when you are eligible to do so) for legal immigration status.

Please see the college Admissions Office to determine if you are AB 540 eligible.
