Write us a sample article. Entertainment, news, feature, opinion and sports articles are all fair game, but remember that you're writing for the school newspaper. Except for opinion, articles should be about something happening on campus or related to students or faculty. Opinion stories and reviews (of a movie, concert, CD or the like) should be interesting to Dana Hills readers. If you've never taken a journalism course, here are a few rules of thumb:

- News stories are straightforward, factual and don't include any opinions from the writers.
- Feature stories are factual and unbiased as well, but they look at events in a more indepth, analytical way, using lots of quotes, colorful details and researched information.
- Opinion stories are just that: your opinion. But that doesn't mean you can just ramble about your feelings use facts and logical arguments to support what you're saying, and try to stay away from talking too much in the first person. Just like you would in an English essay, avoid "I think..." etc.
- Entertainment and sports stories are usually written like feature stories (a profile of a student band, for example, is essentially a feature article on a topic related to entertainment). The exceptions to this are reviews or sports columns; they're essentially opinion articles about a form of entertainment or a sport.

We understand that most students aren't accustomed to writing for a newspaper; we're not looking for people with technical journalism knowledge (though that helps) as much as we are looking for people with the ambition and writing ability who give their full dedication to the task at hand.
