All AP elective courses provide a grade bump in your grade point average (gpa).

AP World History AP European History

Both courses can be taken in place of World History (CP) or as an academic elective. These AP courses will prepare students for college course work in writing, research, reading comprehension, note taking, and time management. Both courses offer an in depth look into either World (non-Western) or European (western) History. Grades 9-10

AP Art History is an academic elective course (can be taken in addition to your required history courses). AP Art History will open your eyes to the rich and vibrant world of art with emphasis on historical causation and cultural influence throughout many cultures, both European and non-Western. Grades 10-12

AP Psychology
